Conceiving plays an outsized role in Berkeley's attack on materialism; and Berkeley has been criticized for of conceiving adopting an account that, carefully considered, is either incoherent or unpersuasive. I propose an interpretation on which Berkeley takes conceiving to be psychologically Since for Berkeley derivative of perceiving. Since for perceiving requires richly normative interpretive activity on the part of the perceiver in addition to stimulation, and since sensory conceiving psychologically derivative of perceiving, conceiving requires similarly normative interpretive activity. argue that this account overcomes the most forceful objections to Berkeley's account of conceiving.
